ACADEMIC YEAR 2019 - 2020

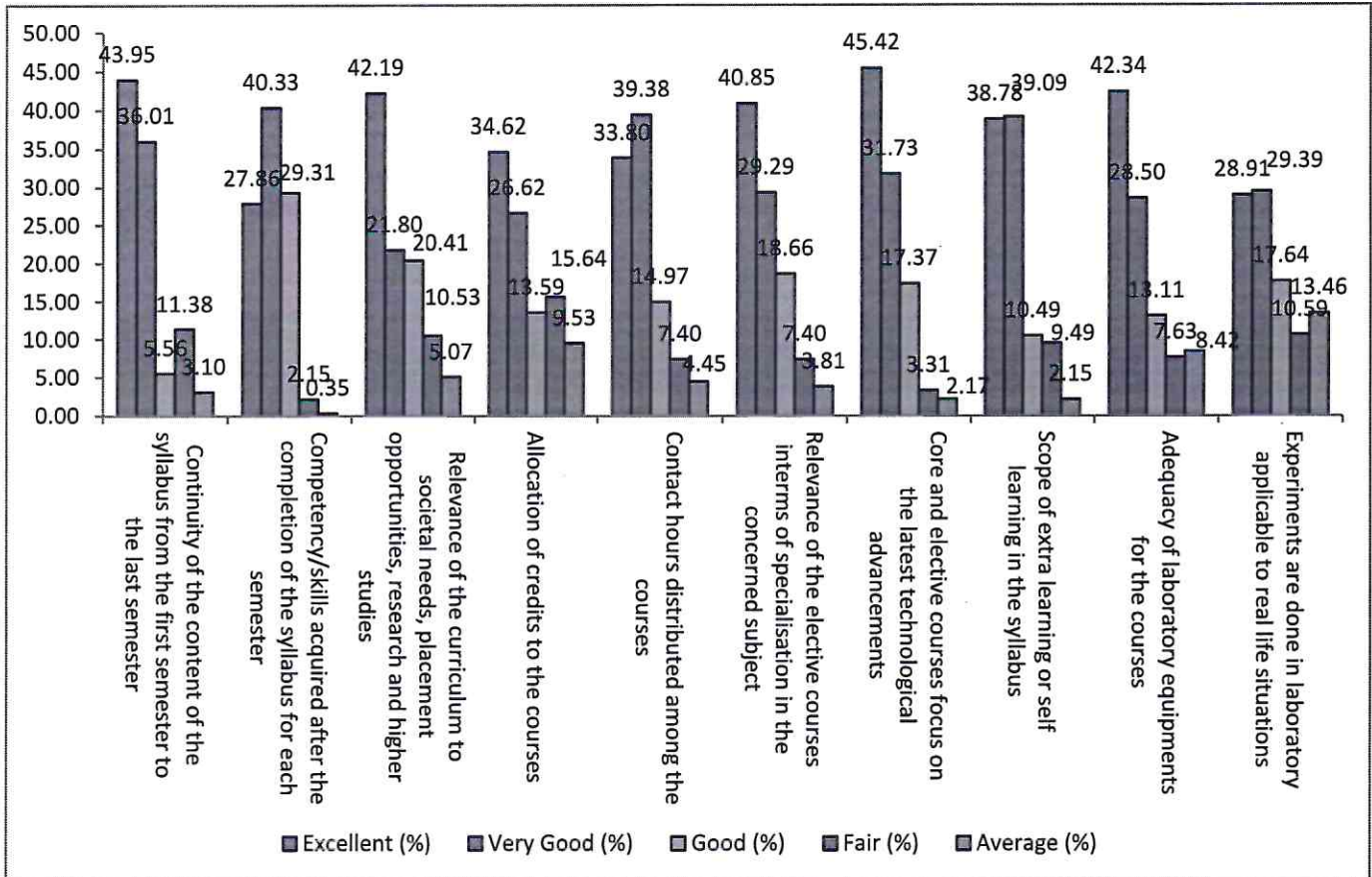

A structured feedback form on Curriculum with Five Point Scale is prepared and collected through online mode. The collected feedback is analyzed by the Department. The analyzed reports are scrutinized. Based on the feedback obtained the Curriculum is revised periodically catering to the needs of the students and demands of the other stakeholders.

III UG

Out of 1429 student respondents, the maximum of 68.23% gave excellent opinion for the parameter 'Relevance of the elective courses in terms of specialization in the concerned subject'. 63.54% students agreed that the competency/skills acquired after the completion of the syllabus for each semester is very good. 35.06% expressed that the relevance of the curriculum to societal needs, placement opportunities, research and higher studies is good.

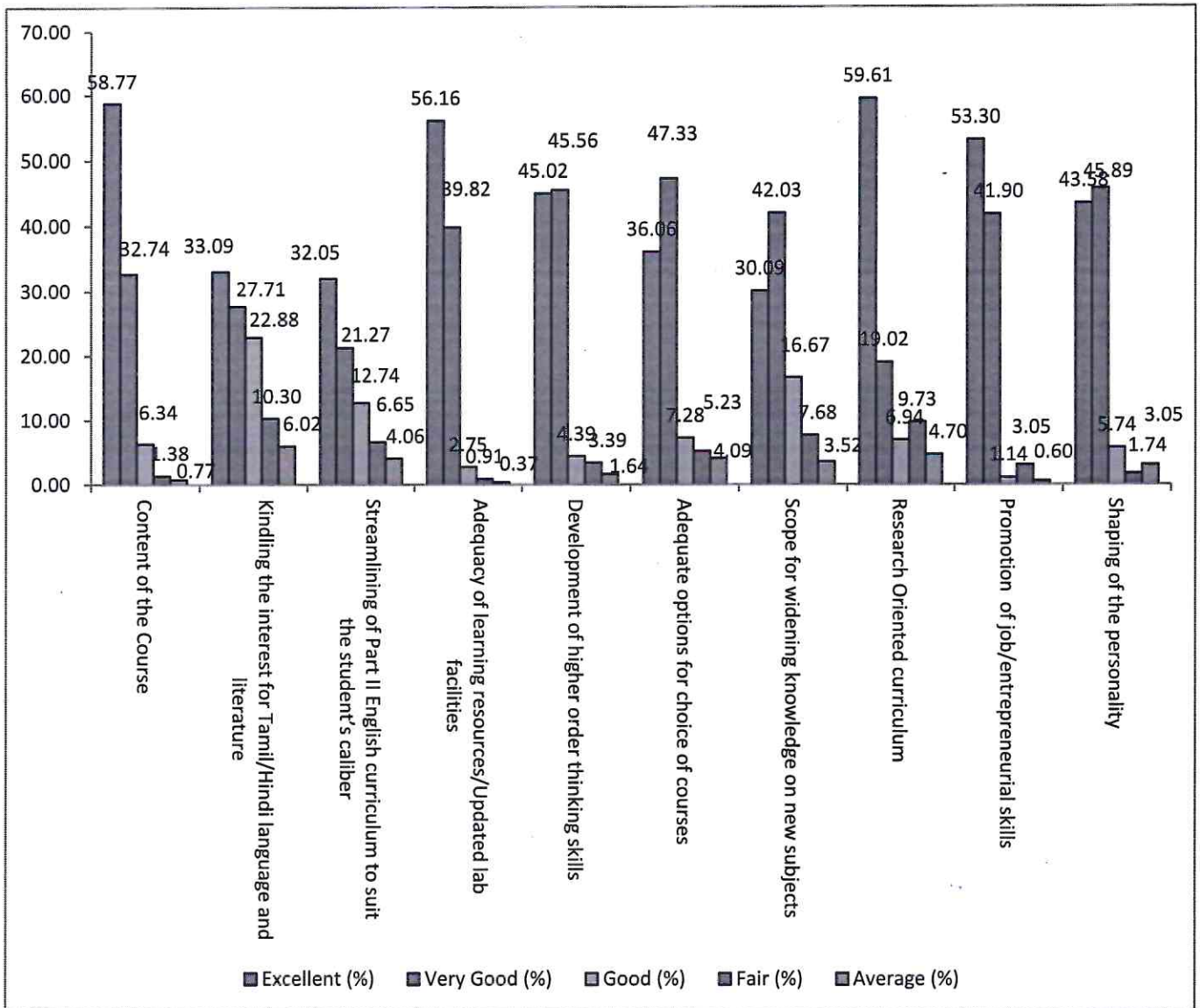
