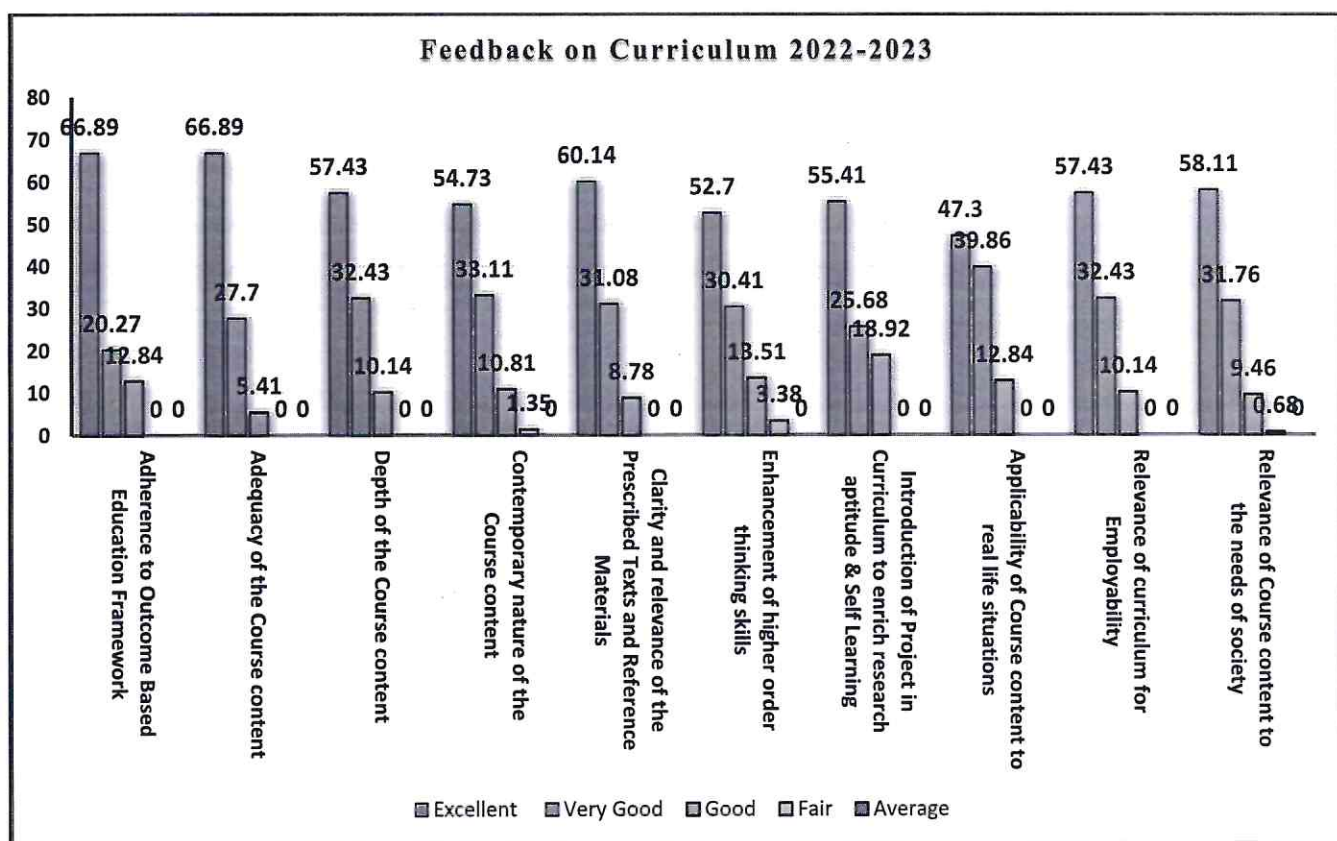
ANALYSIS REPORT

ACADEMIC YEAR 2022-2023

About 66.89% of the teachers including the subject experts considered that the adherence of Curriculum to Outcome Based Education and adequacy of the Course Content were excellent. 60.14% of the teachers stated that the clarity and the relevance of the prescribed texts was excellent. Approximately of 56% agreed that depth of the Course content, contemporary nature of the Course content and the relevance of the Curriculum for employability and relevance of the Course content to the needs of the society were excellent. 18.92 teachers suggested that the introduction of Project in the Curriculum focussing research aptitude and self-learning could be enriched. 91.18% of external examiners agreed that the adequacy of the equipment and computers were excellent and 72.94% agreed that the relevance of the Practical to the courses were excellent. 40.59% of the examiners opined that students' skill in handling the equipment and computers were very good. 14.12% suggested that the students' ability to apply theoretical knowledge in doing experiments could be enhanced. 47.06% of the teachers agreed that the overall performance of the students have been very good.

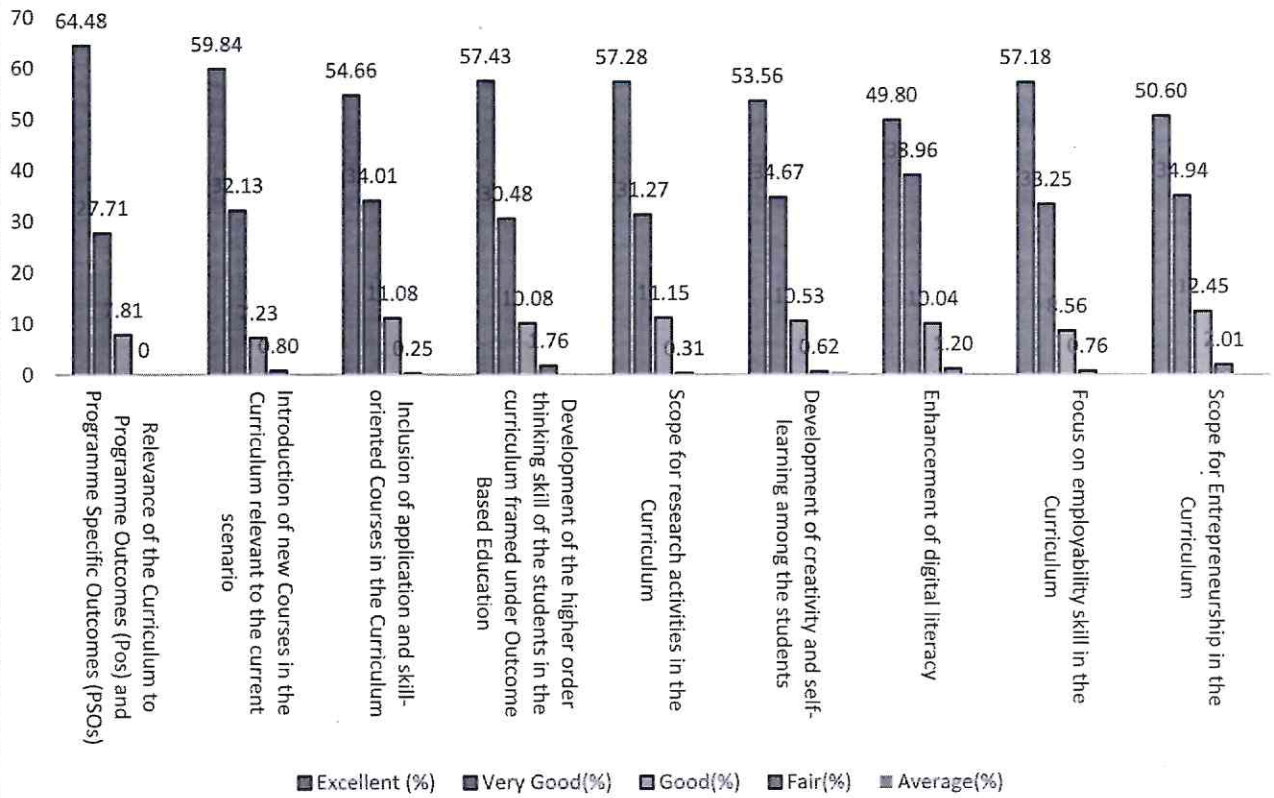

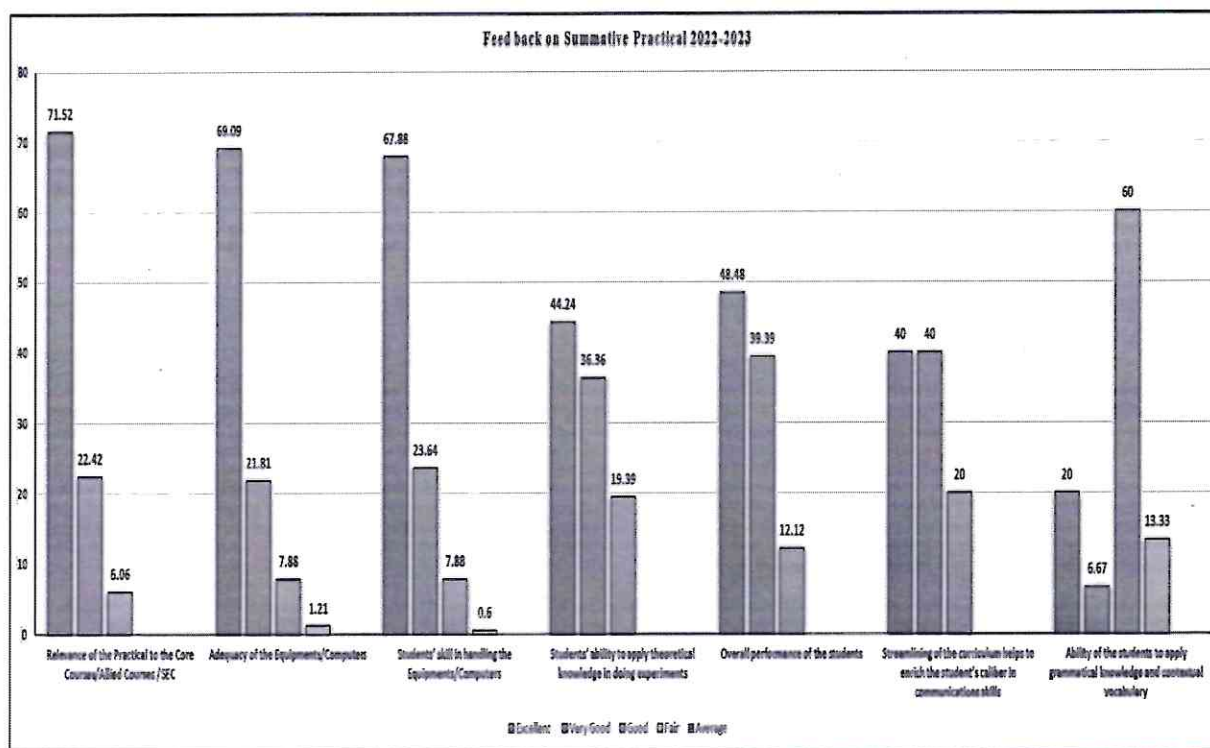

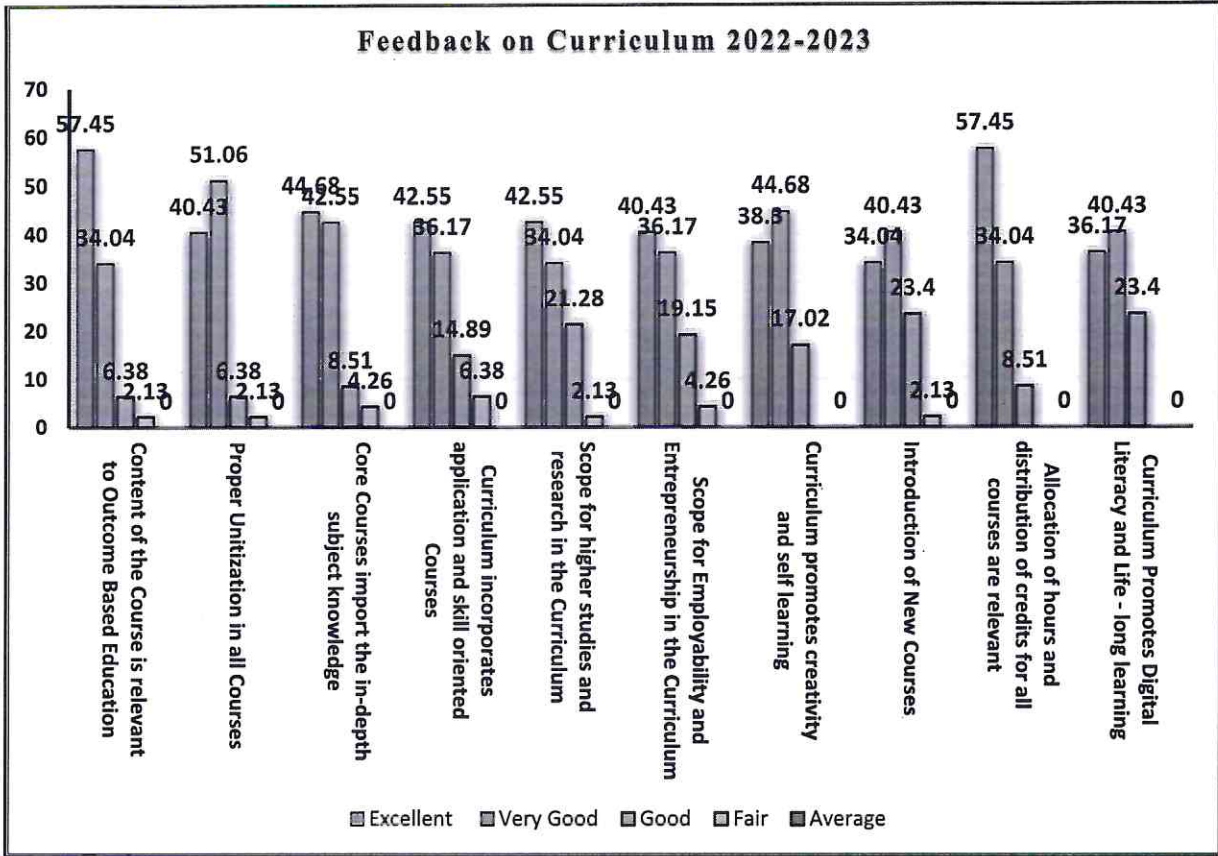
