PART II - ENGLISH

The Courses designed for the students of B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. / BBA / BCA aims at improving their Proficiency in English by introducing them to the varied aspects of the English Language through a variety of literary texts. The course has a three-tiered structure addressing the needs of the students with different levels of comprehension and language acquisition. Students will be categorized into three streams — Advanced Learners (A), Mediocre Learners (B) and Slow Learners (C) on the basis of their performance in the Screening Test conducted at the beginning of the academic year.

Curriculum is designed for each Stream separately based on the students' caliber and the targeted Course Outcomes. With regard to the Evaluation Pattern more focus is given to K4 and K5 for A Stream. K1, K2 and K3 are given priority for C Stream. B Stream has a balanced focus on both the higher order and lower order skills.
